- Objectives:
 - strengthen bilateral
cooperation
 - reduce economic and
social disparities
- Norway's contribution:
ca. 14 billion NOK
- 15 beneficiary states
- 32 programme areas



The objectives of the NEW programme design

- Develop and strengthen bilateral relations
- Ensure stable and predictable framework for participation in the EEA financial mechanism, based on European and international best practice
- Strengthen the long-term capacity and competence of project operators, project coordinators and project partners.
- Contribute to the development of the European Research Area (ERA).

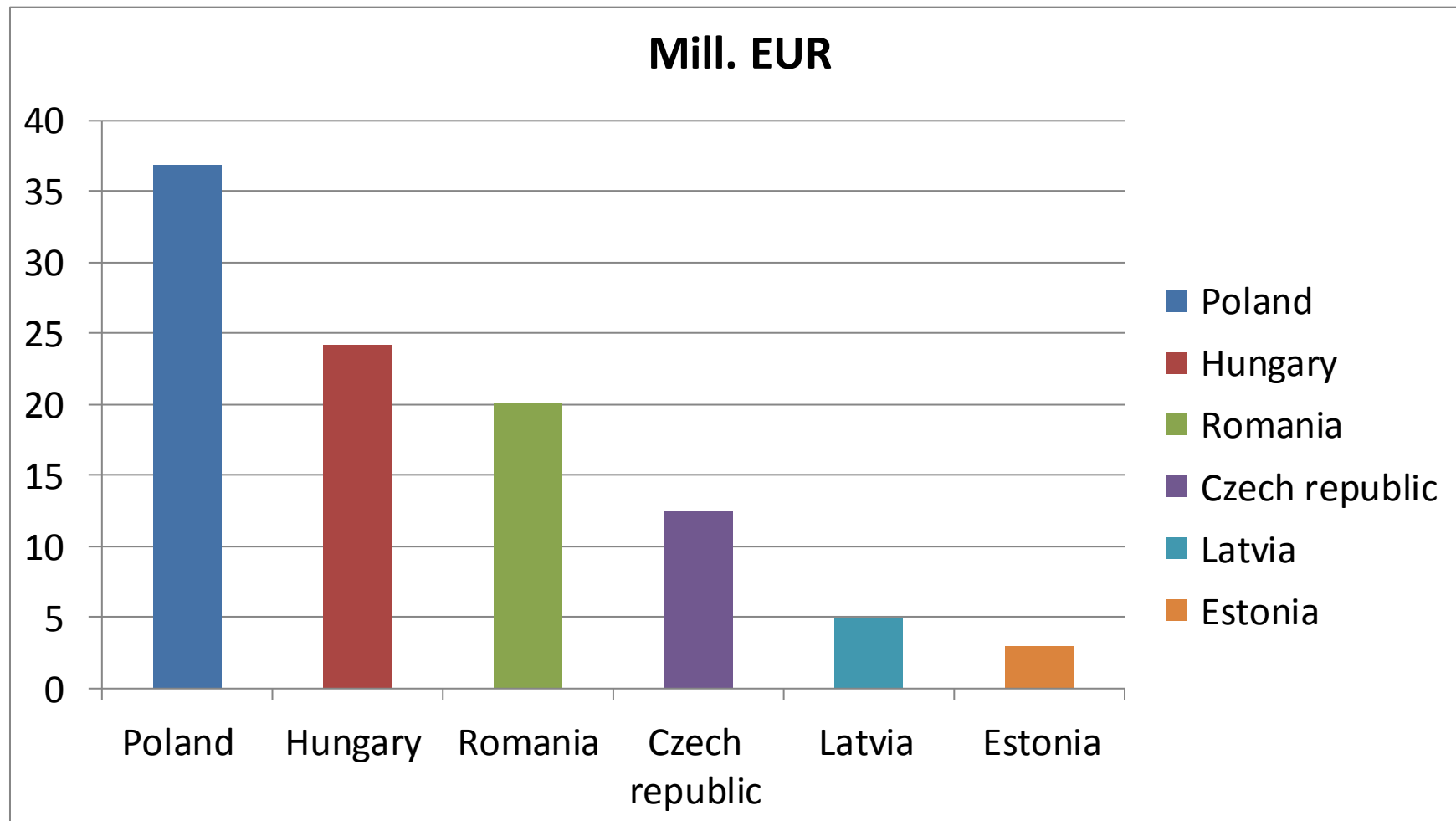

Programme features 1

- Funds are administered in the beneficiary countries
- Experiences from 2002-2009 have led to change
- Annex 12 designed for research programmes
 - based on (simplified) EU guidelines
 - provides a unified set of regulations for all countries
 - Covers: calls, selection, reporting, transfers of funds
- Research Council of Norway:
 - advises on programme development and implementation
 - facilitates contact information flow
 - www.rcn.no/eea Partner Search Database

Programme features 2

- Research projects with at least 1 Norwegian partner and 1 local project leaders; more possible
- Norwegian partners 40-50% share in grant
- Up to 100% of eligible costs covered
- Choice of direct cost only or overhead (20-60%)
- Application sent by local project leader
- Annual reports only
- Invoiced kept “at home” – proof of expenditure sent over

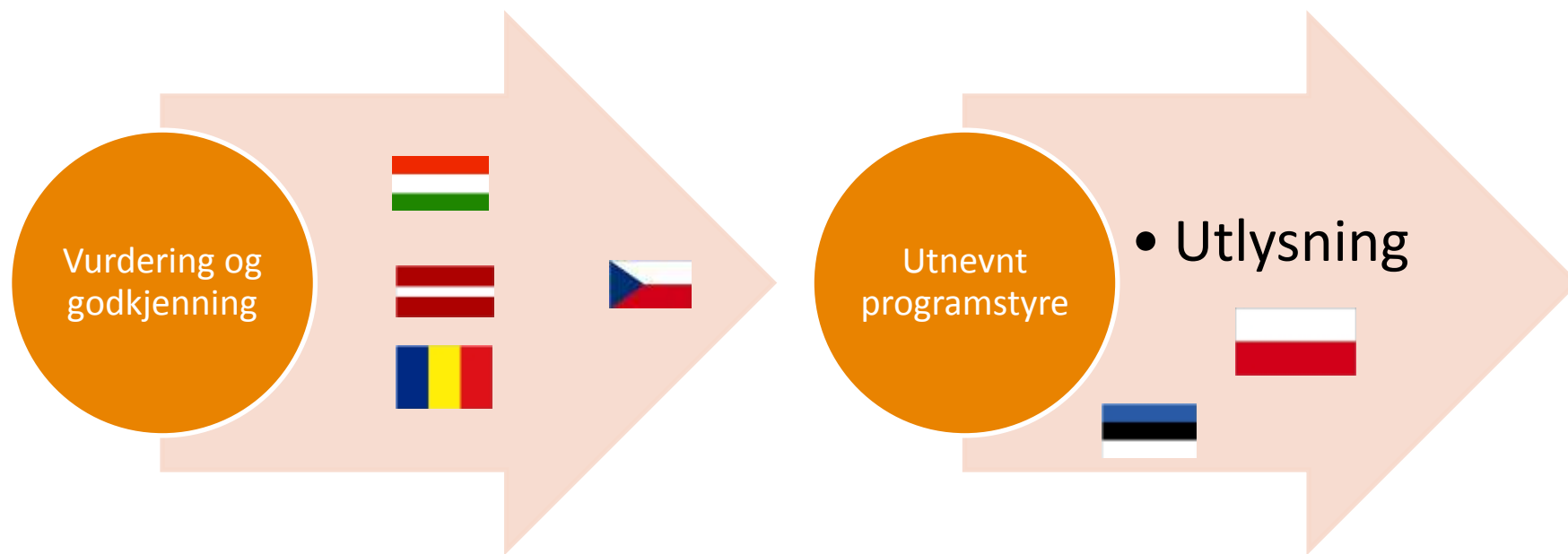

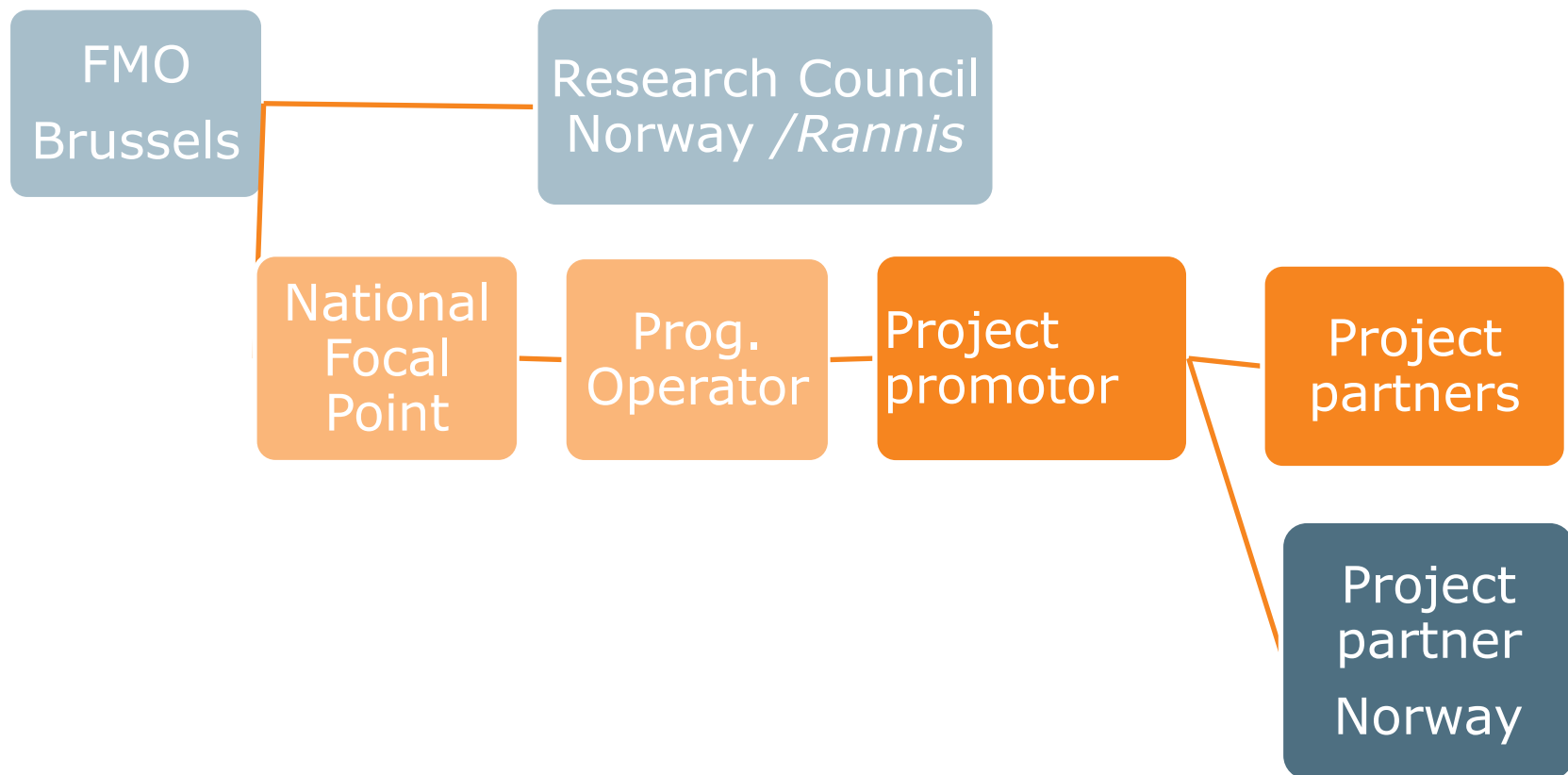

 - revisjonsrapport
 - final publishable summary report
 - report on wider societal implications
 - distribution of financial contribution between Project Promoter and partners
- Leveres senest 60 dager etter at prosjektet er slutt
